A joyous Palm Sunday at Assumption Parish in Boyle Heights, East Los Angeles, in which the Schola Cantorum of the Pacific sang *Hosanna*, to the Son of David as the Invitatory, Blessing of the Palms, Proclamation, and Processional at the 11 a.m. Mass, March 24, 2024.

Choristers, led by Schola founder Fr. Ted Ley, SM, also sang the Gloria Laus et Honor Tibi (All glory, laud, and honor) and John Goss' God so Loved the World a cappella at the vestibule.

The Responsorial Psalm 22 verses were punctuated with the antiphon My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? For the preparation of the gifts, the choir sang from the choir loft, Benedictine Fr. Becket Senchur's Come to Me, all you who thirst, and the late Marianist Fr. Gerald Chinchar's (1943-2023) How Blest Are They Who Follow Christ.

For the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Schola led the congregation in Marty Haugen's "Creation Mass" Holy, Mystery of Faith, and Great Amen. The Lamb of God was Paraguayan folkloric Cordero de Dios. Holy Communion songs included Come O Jesus, Come Into My Heart and St. Bernard of Clairvaux's Latin Jesu Rex Admirabilis (Jesus, Admirable King).

The Gregorian chant in Latin *Parce Domine* (Spare Lord, your people) was sung a cappella in ascending tones as the Recessional.
